## Holy Trinity Church, Winnipeg

The election of the 13<sup>th</sup> Primate of the Anglican Church of Canada will take place at Holy Trinity Church in downtown Winnipeg, Manitoba, a church that dates back to 1868 when it was conceived in the midst of the confusion and anarchy of the Riel Rebellion in the Red River Settlement. Manitoba was not yet a province; Winnipeg was not yet a city

The first church building was completed November 4th, 1868 and enlarged in 1870. It was quickly outgrown, as was its

successor. The present building was completed in 1884, with a seating capacity of 750. This neo-gothic structure is now a designated national historical site. The spiritual life of the parish was solidified under its first permanent Rector, Archdeacon Octave Fortin, who was Rector of the Parish for 42 years.

Holy Trinity is home to a diverse congregation, with parishioners born in more than 30 different countries. Together, the congregation focuses ministries of prayer, downtown mission where we provide a lunch to over 120 people daily, Christian education, worship, and hospitality. Services range across the spectrum of Anglican practice, from traditional B.C.P. to contemporary gospel. The congregation would like to invite delegates to the National Synod to their 2nd annual Gospel Pentecost--a celebration of the 40 days from Resurrection to Pentecost, told through gospel music--on Sunday, June 17th at 7 pm.
