Our ability to listen to one another, engage in meaningful dialogue, solve problems, and make decisions is critical to the success of General Synod. This plenary session will provide opportunities for delegates to practice these critical skills with one another in an interactive and engaging environment.

Almost Paperless Synod

If you are a delegate to Synod you will know that the General Synod Planning Committee (GSPC) has decided, in response to calls for a "greener" Synod, to send the Convening Circular to your computer via "Box.net".

As usual, all resolutions, presentations and worship hymns, prayers, etc. will be projected on two large screens in the Plenary Hall.

When you arrive at General Synod you will receive a DVD containing the entire contents of the Convening Circular. In addition, a few printed copies will be available in a designated spot in the Plenary Hall.

Print copies of the Governance Working Group, Vision 2019 and the Primatial Role Task Force reports will be distributed at General Synod.

You may bring a computer to General Synod for use in the Plenary Hall. A table will be set up in the Plenary Hall so delegates can charge computer batteries. It will be your responsibility to ensure that your computer is secure while the battery is being charged.

The Convening Circular will be posted in late April. Notification of posting will be sent to all delegates, partners, staff, etc.
