General Synod Theme - Draw the Circle Wide, Draw it Wider Still

Approved by the Council of General Synod in November 2005, the General Synod theme, *Draw* the Circle Wide, Draw it Wider Still, incorporates concepts of inclusivity: language, race, culture, theology and the dignity of all people. The circle, with Christ as its centre, can be infinitely wide and draws all to Christ. The circle, a symbol of creation and life, is significant to Indigenous people representing healing, sharing and teaching. It represents continuity, movement, wholeness and openness – some hopes for the future of the Anglican Church of Canada.
