General Synod Companions' Programs (Tentative)

All prices and information shown are tentative and based on the Synod agenda and the number of companions committed to each program.

Program # 1 - Deluxe Historic Halifax City Tour

Friday, June 4, 2010; (approx. 3 hours, starting at 1:00pm) \$50 per person.

Join a kilted driver/guide on a bus tour that will provide an excellent overview of peninsular Halifax. View: Historic Properties, the Spring Garden Road area, Province House, Old Town Clock, St. Paul's Church, City Hall, Grand Parade, Government house, the busy port, Victorian Halifax Public Gardens, residential areas, the Titanic burial site, and much more.

Program # 2 – South Shore of Nova Scotia including Peggy's Cove

Saturday, June 5, 2010; (full day, starting in the morning) \$50 per person.

A tour by bus to visit and learn about the communities from Halifax to the town of Lunenburg, including Peggy's Cove, Chester, and Mahone Bay. Includes a brief tour of the town of Lunenburg where you will attend a lunch and learn about the rich and interesting history of St. John's Anglican Church.

Program # 3 – Nature and Whale Watching Water Cruise

Monday, June 7, 2010; (approx. 2.5 hours, starting in the afternoon) \$35 per person.

Board the Haligonian III at Historic Properties for a cruise about Halifax, the second largest sea port in the world. Learn about the history and geography of the Halifax Harbour and the lobster fishing industry. An experienced guide will help to identify features of the wildlife seen in the area.

Program # 4 – Land of Evangeline

Wednesday, June 9, 2010; (full day, starting in the morning) \$55 per person.

This tour takes us as far as Wolfville in the Annapolis Valley making many stops along the way, including a tour of the Grand Pre National Historic Site (the site of the Expulsion of the Acadians in 1755), a winery, a farmers' market, and Canada's first Fair Trade Coffee Roster just to name a few possibilities.

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
